People with CF and their family members age 16 and older are invited to attend **ResearchCon** on **Feb 28, 2019** - the first virtual event dedicated to CF science and research.



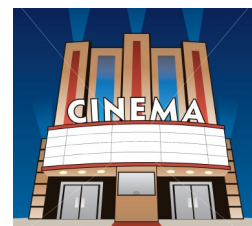
